

In addition to rigorous academic offerings that include video lessons and evaluated exercises to ensure mastery, it also has life skill classes, like personal finance, that can help kids and adults alike.

Another fun and free educational resource is www.thecrashcourse.com. There are currently 32 courses available from astronomy to study skills. Each course consists of a series of short and witty YouTube videos meant as supplemental material for an academic course in high school, but they are very accessible even for middle schoolers.
